I have been retained by The Arrangements Committee of the International Association of Individual Psychology

to do publicity for its Congress and the ALFRED ADLER CENTENNIAL Celebration in New York in February and July of 1970.

Plans include bringing the activities of Adlerians throughout our country and abroad to the attention of national magazines as well as network television and radio stations. The purpose is to arouse their interest in doing stories on the significance of Adlerian theories to the 1970s.

Since some of these media work as far in advance as one year, for the best results it is necessary for me to have the following information as quickly as possible:

- 1. The exact name and activities of your Societies, Clinics, or Institutes, including (a) what your services are; and (b) your involvement with other agencies, educational institutions, and other community organizations.
- The names and professional affiliations of all your therapists, including names of their publications, where they teach, hospitals served.

- 5. A paragraph summing up what you think is most relevant in Alfred Adler's ideas to help leaders as well as the average individual cope with today's problems.
