IPNL, Organ of the International Association of Individual Psychology, Jan & Book John 1970 Feb., 1970, contains an account by Paul Rom of the frustration and insults encountered by one adult during his experience of learning to drive. Repeatedly, the individual was discouraged by his instructors and made to feel that the task was one that he was not capable of conquering. It was suggested by one of his many instructors when she knew the driving test was scheduled, that "It will need a miracle for you to pass it!"

This instruction was from one adult to another adult, but the demeaning attitudes and discourteous remarks were many. One can compare this to the instruction which many adults give to children. They are often much less thoughtful and considerate of children than they would be to a fellow adult. Especially, children who are not quick to respond and who appear to be slow learners often receive harsh, impatient, and inappropriate instruction from adults.
