NEWS ITEMS

Dr. Lucia Radl, New York, was interviewed by Radio Free Europe which broadcases programs to countries behind the Iron Curtain. This talk was aired to Bucharest, Rumania, on April 23 and 24. The topic was related to psychiatry, the Adlerian movement in the U.S. and to Women's Liberation. The half-hour program was conducted in Rumanian language.

Dr. Alfred Farau, Associate Dean, Alfred Adler Institute of New York, delivered a speech to the Pirquet Society of Clinical Medicine, New York Academy of Sciences on October 14, 1970, which was titled "The Legacy of Alfred Adler." This most interesting and informative speech was published in the "Pirquet Bulletin of Clinical Medicine" under the caption "Alfred Adler Centennial" and ishighly recommended for our readers. Mrs. Mary Dreier reported that Parent-Study Groups have been conducted in the Cedar Fall, Iowa, area for twelve years and are still going strong. These study groups were started by Dr. Manford Sonstegard and were the first such groups to be developed west of the Mississippi.

Mrs. Wynn Carr reported that the Parent Study Group of Tucoma, Washington, under the direction of Keith Runion sponsored an all-day workshop on April 8, 1972. Dr. John Platt of Flkgrove, California, was the featured speaker and conducted a family counseling session in the morning and a discussion session with seven sixtherade students. Morpantown, West Virginia - News of parent study groups is spreading in this area. The April 18th program of Dr. Sonstegard's TV series, "Growing Fim Up," shown on Channel 24 out of Morgantown, was a session of our current Children: The Challenge study group. As a result of the program, there is interest in new groups in Clarksburg and among WVU Medical Center wives. New study group leaders are emerging from the current group and new study groups are being planned.
