PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear fellow members:

We have just received the exciting news that NASAP has been awarded a grant of \$25,000 for publications by the Seymour E. Clonick Estate through the efforts of Sydney Roth. The stipulation of the grant is that the Society establish a Publications Fund and that the first project will be a book on family education. The grant culminates an intense effort of several months to obtain such a grant by the Executive Committee and Sydney Roth.

The challenge facing NASAP is setting up guidelines on how this money will be used and for what purpose. I personally have strong feelings that we need to develop policies that will not just dissipate this sum. We should invest in projects that are likely to bring an income and a return to NASAP so NASAP in turn can fund additional projects. Therefore, we need to develop and/or support projects that have a good chance of being financially successful.

Recently, Ray Corsini sent out a letter encouraging Adlerians to write a self-help book based on Adlerian principles that has the possibility of being a best seller. Perhaps an effort such as that could accomplish these ends. What are your ideas? What sort of material either printed, on film, or videotape would be an asset to your particular efforts to educate and help others in your community?

In other news, Heinz Ansbacher has published another article, this time in the Bulletin of the Menninger Clinic, on the topic of "'To Love and to Work,' Adlerian Thoughts on an Anecdote About Freud." Heinz has been kind enough to keep the Executive Committee and the Central Office informed of his publications in journals other than the Journal of Individual Psychology and Individual Psychologist. I find it helpful to know what Adlerians are publishing in other journals. Perhaps we could have as a regular feature of the newsletter a listing of such publications by NASAP members, if authors are willing to notify the Central Office.

LETTERS TO EDITOR

Honduras Report

May, 1982

I hope this brief letter finds all going well for you and NASAP. I would like to inform the Society that at the end of April, I had the pleasure of being invited to the American School of San Salvador (capital of El Salvador) so as to introduce their staff to Adler's practical theory of human behavior and its applicability in the classroom. As always, the recognition of the purposefulness in misbehavior proved to be an extremely useful way of enabling the classroom teacher to gain greater collaboration from his/her students. In addition, two parent groups were started at the school using the STEP program in both English and Spanish.

After three years in Honduras, I soon will be residing in Tucson, Arizona where I plan to slowly but surely pursue the doctorate. In filing this last report, I'd like to acknowledge that my experience has shown me that many Central Americans are looking for a useful theory that will help them understand human behavior. As such, Adlerian ideas have been well received. In short, it seems to me that the Adlerian philosophy of life, concept of man, and its basic practicality can serve well this part of the world, where the quest for democracy and social equality is so evident.
